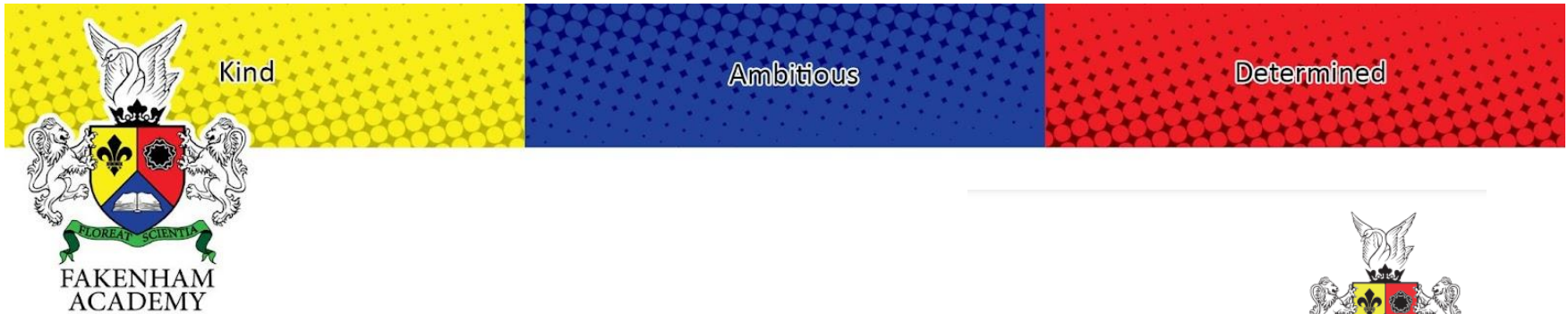

Attendance

Your attendance will be monitored on a daily basis. If your attendance is not above 95% it will start to become a concern and you will be spoken to and parents can be fined. It is essential you keep your attendance high so that you do not miss learning. **Our approach is extremely SUPPORTIVE to begin with.**

IS MY CHILD WELL ENOUGH FOR SCHOOL?

A guide for parents and carers

Children should attend school whenever they are well enough to take part in their normal day.
A minor illness, ache, pain or injury does not usually mean your child needs to stay at home.

COME TO SCHOOL

Your child can normally attend with the following:

Common illnesses (if otherwise well)

- Runny or blocked nose
- Slight cough
- Mild sore throat
- Mild headache
- Cold sore
- Conjunctivitis (if otherwise well)
- Head lice or nits
- Hand, foot and mouth (if otherwise well)
- Threadworms
- Ringworm (once treatment has started)
- Slapped cheek rash (if otherwise well)

Minor injuries and discomfort

- Small cuts or grazes
- Bruises
- Blisters
- Mild muscle aches
- Minor sprains or strains (where they can move safely)
- Minor sports injuries
- Mild toothache (while awaiting treatment)

Please don't keep your child at home simply because they cannot take part in PE.

STILL COME TO SCHOOL TELL US WHAT SUPPORT IS NEEDED

These conditions do not normally require a day off school. Send your child in and let us know what support they may need – we can help.

- Using crutches
- A cast, splint or support
- Reduced mobility
- Unable to take part in PE temporarily
- Recovering from a minor procedure
- Periods (if required)
- A minor injury that makes certain activities difficult
- An ongoing health condition affecting their school day

SEND THEM IN – WE CAN HELP

Talk to us about any adjustments your child may need. We can help make sure they are comfortable, safe and able to take part in school life.

KEEP YOUR CHILD AT HOME

Your child should stay at home when they have:

- Vomiting or diarrhoea** (kept at home until 48 hours after the last episode)
- Chickenpox** (kept at home until all spots have crusted over, usually around 5 days after they first appear)
- Scarlet fever** (kept at home until 24 hours after starting antibiotics)
- Impetigo** (kept at home until sores have crusted/healed or 48 hours after starting antibiotics)
- A diagnosed infectious illness** where a healthcare professional has advised that they should remain at home
- A high temperature** (keep at home until they are better)

If your child is unwell due to any other specific medical condition and a healthcare professional has advised they should not attend, please follow that advice.

Student attends one full week (both AM and PM session).



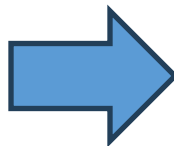
Tutor reads the Attendance Streak list out for their form. Tutor hands the raffle ticket over to the student (these will be in form trays).

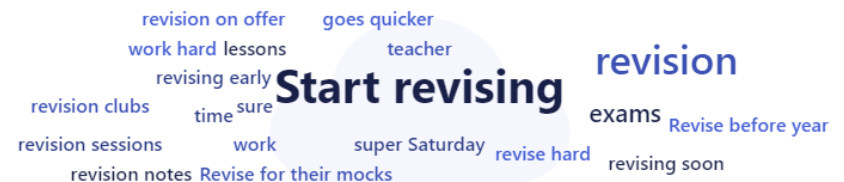

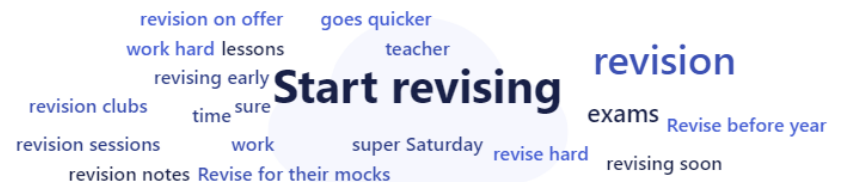
